Their love for the arts has manifested in their gallery as they exhibit young talented artists from Grenoble; Pierre Joseph, Bernard Joisten, Dominique Gonzalez-Foerster and Philippe Perrin before the world gawks amazingly at their end results.

Air de Paris has gained amazing recognition and has achieved a respected reputation as they represent renowned artists such as: Philippe Parreno, Liam Gillick, Rob Pruitt, Trisha Donnelly, Bruno Serralongue and Torbjørn Rødland and a portfolio of historical artists such as Guy de Cointet, Dorothy Iannone, Allen Ruppersberg as well as
