A riddle: what falls but never breaks? (Answer at the end of the paragraph.) Falls Never 10 Breaks, anyway, is the title of Sarah Morris's new show, whose centrepiece is Strange Magic (2014), which – following her scanning, Godfrey Reggio-indebted surveys of cities (Los Angeles, New York, Washington, Miami, Beijing...), portraits of Hollywood insiders and modernist architectural landmarks the Farnsworth House and the Glass House – is another exploration of surfaces and manufactured desires: specifically, those engineered by French luxury house LVMH. No doubt we can expect some of the American artist's tightly designed abstract paintings, too, which have regularly flanked her filmic excursuses and whose clear-cut interlocking geometries and alluring colour schemes cogently anticipate our own desire for them, cake-and-eat-it style. Oh, and the riddle? Night, duh. Martin Herbert
